






Pollinator Gardens

NATIVE PLANT LIST

- Pollinators are essential for our food supply.
- They need our help.
- The flowering natives below are hardy, drought tolerant and will make your garden a magnet for pollinators!
- Natives have the best chance of survival; they are acclimated to our climate.
- This is just a short list – there are many more plants that will attract pollinators.

Plant	Light	Soil	Water	Pollinator	Notes
Asters 	Sun or light shade	Any; not picky	All drought tolerant; except Bill's Big Blue – medium to drought tolerant	Bees Butterflies Birds	Best types for pollinators: Fanny's, Bill's Big Blue and California Aster. Bloom time fall - as late as November.
California Poppies 	Full sun	Rich, well draining soil	Minimal watering	Bees	Planted by seed.
Penstemon 	Full sun or partial shade	Prefers fast draining, non-clay soil	All on the list are drought tolerant	Bees Hummingbirds Wasps	Best types: Beard tongue, Pikes Peak Purple, Scarlet bugler
Ceanothus 	Full sun	Clay soil	Drought tolerant	Bees Butterflies	Best types: California Lilac, Ray Hartman-part-shade okay Skylark
California Fuchsia 	Full sun	Tolerates clay and sand	Drought tolerant	Hummingbirds Bees
